DETAILED INFORMATION

Course aims and objectives

This course introduces students to specialized types of tourism such as mountain tourism, cycling tourism, kayaking, skiing, caving, horseback riding, sailing, and trekking. It places particular emphasis on the planning, organization, and responsible and safe execution of tourism activities.

During the course, participants will also learn the basics of topography, navigation, rescue procedures, sustainable tourism, as well as the legal and environmental aspects of operating within qualified tourism. They will develop teamwork, leadership, and effective communication skills in various terrain and weather conditions.

1.	Providing knowledge covering the basic terminology related to tourism.

3.	Providing knowledge about the institutional environment and legal aspects of active and qualified tourism in Poland.
4.	Providing knowledge on tourism infrastructure and opportunities for practicing qualified tourism in Poland.
5.	Introducing selected forms of qualified tourism: hiking, skiing, caving, cycling, horseback riding, kayaking, sailing, and diving.
6.	Presenting the personnel and organizations promoting the development of qualified tourism in Poland.
7.	Introducing organizations that support the development of qualified tourism in Poland.
8.	Developing skills in presenting topics and cooperating in a group setting.
9.	Providing knowledge covering the basic terminology related to tourism.
10.	Developing the ability to organize selected qualified tourism events such as canoeing trips, hikes, trekking camps, etc.
