DETAILED INFORMATION**Course aims and objectives**

This course introduces students to specialized types of tourism such as mountain tourism, cycling tourism, kayaking, skiing, caving, horseback riding, sailing, and trekking. It places particular emphasis on the planning, organization, and responsible and safe execution of tourism activities. During the course, participants will also learn the basics of topography, navigation, rescue procedures, sustainable tourism, as well as the legal and environmental aspects of operating within qualified tourism. They will develop teamwork, leadership, and effective communication skills in various terrain and weather conditions.
