#### Course aims and objectives

1. Provide the students with key issues and contemporary ethical and social debates surrounding sport and PE with particular emphasis on human rights issues in sports.
2. To deepen knowledge and foster critical reflection on the human rights in sport and PE, drawing on examples of good anti-discriminatory and inclusive practices.
3. To enhance students' professional and social competencies and cultivate appropriate attitudes towards injustice, inequalities and discrimination by highlighting the socio-cultural determinants of sport and school-based physical education in postmodern societies.
4. To acquaint students with key issues, trajectories of change, and contemporary social debates surrounding sport and physical education, with particular emphasis on questions of gender, sexuality, ethnicity, class, and racial differences.
